In compliance with ordering paragraph 107 of Decision (D.) 24-12-030, this tier 3 advice letter seeks Commission authorization to increase rates by \$858,317 or 0.80% from 2026 rates as submitted on November 17, 2025 by advice letter 416-W.

The increase pertains to rate base offset, generated by the completion of three capital projects that are used and useful, and placed in service on December 31, 2024. Suburban requests an effective date of February 1, 2026.

Background

This request is made pursuant to Ordering Paragraph No. 107 of D.24-12-030 which states:

107. Suburban Water System's requested budget in the amount of \$15,785,590 for projects P-2, P-5, P-8, P-10, and P-21 is denied as they were previously approved in prior general rate case applications but were never constructed. Suburban Water System may file a tier 3 advice letter when P-2, P-5, P-8, P-10, and P-21 are used and useful.

This request involving multiple subprojects within projects P-2 and P-8 complies with the D.24-12-030 requirement that multiple projects be packaged together into a single advice letter. This request also complies with D.24-12-030, which allows Suburban to file a Tier 3 advice letter for these projects. Moreover, since these projects have been complete and in service since December 2024, it would not be appropriate for the Commission to defer consideration of this request until Suburban's upcoming general rate case ("GRC"), given that a decision for that GRC is not expected until December 2026 at the earliest.

The soft copies of the work papers supporting the requested rate base offset are supplied separately to Water Division.

Suburban first proposed these projects in the previous GRC application A.20-03-001 with cost estimates derived from similar projects constructed prior to 2020, competitively bid the projects, and selected the lowest proposal to maintain reliable water service and affordable rates for our customers.

Since 2019, construction and equipment costs have risen sharply due to sustained inflation, supply chain disruptions, and labor shortages linked to the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic. On March 4, 2020, shortly after Suburban filed its 2020 GRC, Governor Newsom declared the COVID-19 pandemic as a State Emergency which lasted more than three years, which officially ended on May 11, 2023. Hence, the originally proposed estimates are no longer reasonable due to changed economic conditions. These changed conditions include limited availability of raw materials and finished goods, transportation delays, and workforce reductions. As a result, the 2019 estimates are unrealistically low; the amounts requested in this advice letter reflect the

current market conditions at the time the projects were completed.

For example, the original estimated cost of replacing the water tank at Plant 128 was based on a rate of \$0.72/Gallon derived from the Plant 408 reservoir project completed in 2018. When Suburban submitted the Plant 128 project for competitive bid, however, the *lowest* bid included a rate of \$3.12/gallon, more than 4 times the previous project and the amount originally proposed in 2020.

Plant 128 is a critical facility that provides both domestic and firefighting water to the Hacienda Heights area, which is designated as a CPUC Tier 2 High Fire Threat District (HFDT). The area serves approximately 20,000 residents and contains 12 pressure zones. Due to the challenging topography, there are only two water supply sources, one of which is Plant 128. Several pump stations and tanks (at locations 132, 162, and 165) are required to move water to the system's highest elevations. Plant 128 is the starting point of this supply chain, making the condition of its storage tank critical to the overall reliability and operation of the system.

Suburban experienced similar cost increases in its installation of backup power diesel generators at Plant 165 and 506. Suburban based its proposal in GRC application A.20-03-001 on quotations provided by vendors dated 7/19/2014. This project was delayed due to the more than 100-week lead time for generators created by the COVID-19 supply chain distribution and high demand for generators that followed Winter Storm Uri in Texas, and wildfires in California, and subsequent rollout of Public Safety Power Shutdowns (PSPS). Further, Suburban experienced inflation in the costs of all of its projects, and needed to delay projects, including these generators, to keep CAPEX spending within the CAPEX amount adopted in the GRC by the CPUC. At the time Suburban had sufficient CAPEX budget available and the generators were available, the quotations provided by vendors dated 11/12/2021 had increased between 35% and 38% compared to the cost estimates.

Backup generators are essential for maintaining the reliability of critical water supply sources during power outages. These sources include water production and distribution plants that serve as the primary supply for one or more pressure zones. Without backup power, customers in these zones would lose access to emergency water and fire protection, creating significant safety risks for our customers.

Suburban's costs to complete projects in 2024 were higher than estimates prepared prior to 2020 due to the reasons noted above. These reasonable costs for these important projects should be approved in this Advice letter request.

Tier Designation and Effective Date

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 3 designation, and Suburban requests this advice filing become effective on February 1, 2026.

Notice

Customer Notice – Individual customer notice of this advice letter is not required pursuant to Water Industry Rule 3.1 of GO 96-B, as the offset is less than 10% of the revenue requirement. However, Suburban will provide a bill message identifying the rate increase in the first bill that

includes the rate change.

In compliance with General Rule 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this advice letter has been mailed or electronically transmitted to all interested and affected parties as detailed in Attachment A.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.

If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact Suburban Water Systems at (626) 543-2500.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.

- 1. The facilities for service to a privately owned fire protection system shall be installed by the Utility or under the Utility's direction. Cost for the entire installation, shall be paid for by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
- 2. The expense of maintaining the private fire protection facilities on the applicant's premises (including the vault, meter and backflow device) shall be paid for by the applicant.
- 3. All facilities paid for by the applicant shall be the sole property of the applicant. The Utility and its duly authorized agents shall have the right to ingress to, and egress from the premises for all purposes relating to said facilities.
- 4. The minimum diameter for the service pipe to fire protection service shall be four inches, and the maximum diameter shall be not more than the diameter of the main to which the service is connected.
- 5. If a distribution main of adequate size to service a private fire protection system in addition to all other normal service does not exist in the street or alley adjacent to the premises to be served, then a main extension from the nearest existing main of adequate capacity shall be installed by the Utility. The cost of such main extension attributable to the fire protection requirement shall be paid to the Utility as a contribution in aid of construction.

- The fire hydrant shall be used for fire fighting purposes and fire drills only. Water use for fire drills will be limited to 15 minutes per week.
- 3. The replacement, enlargement, or relocation of any hydrant made at the request of the customer shall be paid for by the customer.
- 4. All facilities paid for by the applicant shall be the sole property of the applicant. The Utility and its duly authorized agents shall have the right to ingress to, and egress from the premises for all purposes relating to said facilities.
