Goal:

Achieve a thirty percent (30%) MANDATORY reduction in total and daily water demand.

Triggers / Reasons:

When any of the following occur:

- 1. When the water treatment capacity reached for three (3) or more days in a week is equal to or greater than ninety percent (90%).
- 2. When well pump hours per day for more than three (3) days is equal to or greater than 22 hours.
- 3. When the TCEQ, a governing groundwater district, or a contracted water supplier requests initiation of a thirty percent usage reduction.

Mandatory Restrictions:

The Utility enforces the following mandatory restrictions in outdoor water use:

- Use of automatic irrigation systems and hose end sprinklers is prohibited.
- Use of soaker hoses on building foundations is allowed from 6:00 AM to 9:00 AM or from 8:00 PM to 11:59 PM on the designated watering day.
- Use of a faucet-filled bucket or watering can of five (5) gallons or less is permitted on the designated watering day from 7:00 AM to 9:00 AM or from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM.
- Washing vehicles, motorbikes, boats, trailers, airplanes or other vehicles with a hand-held bucket or a hand-held hose equipped with an automatic shutoff nozzle is prohibited.
- Topping off pools is prohibited.
- Washing or rinsing driveways, sidewalks, or streets is prohibited at all times. The use of water for construction purposes from designated fire hydrants is permitted under special permit.

Violations & Penalties:

First Violation: The customer will be notified by written notice of their specific violation.

Second Violation: After written notice, the utility may install a flow restricting device in the line to limit the amount of water which will pass through the meter in a 24-hour period. The utility may charge the customer for the actual cost of installing and removing the flow restricting device, not to exceed \$50.00.

<u>Third Violation:</u> The utility may discontinue service at the meter for a period of seven (7) days, or until the end of the calendar month, whichever period is shorter. The normal reconnect fee of the utility will apply for restoration of service.
